**DESCRIPTION:**

Managing dental implants in the esthetic zone is one of the most challenging and demanding treatments in dentistry.

This is a 2-hour presentation highlighting rules of engagement for planing anterior dental implants. Emphasis will be placed on understanding the biologic remodeling process post-extraction, 3-dimensional implant placement as well as hard and soft tissue augmentation. The final esthetics are not only the white esthetics, but the pink esthetics should be restored as well by means of a provisional crown to create a proper emergence profile.

Using multiple clinical scenarios, treatments will be discussed with emphasis on restorative-periodontal perspectives to obtain a natural harmonious smile with stable periodontium.

OBJECTIVES:

- Understand socket remodeling and effect on esthetics.
- Describe diagnostic components leading to a successful treatment planning.
- Recognize therapies to augment peri-implant hard and soft tissues.
- Follow step-by-step technique for immediate provisionalization and soft tissue emergence profile.

Dr. Kinaia is the Associate Director of the Graduate Periodontics Specialty Program at the University of Detroit Mercy School of Dentistry. He received his DDS (1999) and Certificate and MS in Periodontics and Dental Implants (2008) from the University of Detroit Mercy School of Dentistry. Dr. Kinaia, also served as the Program Director at the Boston Institute for Dental Research and Education in Dubai.

His areas of interest include dental implants, periodontal therapy and advanced soft tissue and bone grafting for teeth and implants. He lectures nationally and internationally on the latest trends in Periodontics and dental implants.
